

CRB Response Update

March 16-27, 2015

- 34 adult CRB were detected (6 off JBPH-HI) and no (0) larvae were detected during this reporting period.
- 17,000 palms were visually surveyed during this period.
- 17 new delimiting survey barrel traps were placed and 139 trap services were conducted on 145 total barrel traps during this period.
- 4 new delimiting survey panel traps were placed and 2,998 trap services were conducted on 2,785 total panel traps during this period.
- 5 sq. mi. grids were visually surveyed for CRB presence during this period out of 275 sq. mi. surveyed to date.
- 2 mulch sites were visually surveyed for CRB presence during this period.
- 2 dead or damaged palms were removed during this period.
- No (0) palms were detected with CRB damage during this period.
- 3/16/15 – Darcy Oishi assumed the role of Incident Commander for the response. Rob Curtiss is Deputy Incident Commander.
- 3/18/15 – HDOA will be receiving \$ 2.2 million in Farm Bill money for Federal Fiscal Year 2015.
- A total of 109 persons were provided outreach information and materials during this reporting period.
 - 3/23/15 – Military Liaison Rebecca Smith conducted 2 outreach events on base. The Triennial DoD Pest Management Workshop and the Armed Forces Pest Management Board Meeting (AFPMB). Approximately 30 people in attendance.
- **Beetle Fact:** The CRB life-cycle can range from 4-9 months; when conditions are favorable there may be more than 3 generations per year
