CRB Response Update March 2-13, 2015

- 42 adult CRB were detected (10 off JBPH-HI) and no (0) larvae were detected during this reporting period.
- 37 new delimiting survey barrel traps were placed and 135 trap services were conducted on 128 total barrel traps during this period.
- 31 new delimiting survey panel traps were placed and 2,531 trap services were conducted on 2,781 total panel traps during this period.
- 4 mulch sites were visually surveyed for CRB presence during this period.
- 3 palms were detected with CRB damage during this period.
- 3/2/15 The Hawaii Invasive Species Council (HISC) awarded HDOA, USDA, and JBPHH an award as OAHU MVP for their work combating CRB. In addition, The Hawaii State Legislature presented a Certificate to Honor and Commend HDOA, USDA, and JBPHH on their joint response to CRB.
- 3/2/15 Military liaison Rebecca Smith presented a CRB outreach training for the Environmental Coordinators and
- Environmental Protection Specialists for JBPHH. 12 individuals were in attendance.
- 3/2/15 IC Rob Curtiss was interviewed by Brent Remadna from <u>KHON2 News</u> about the new trapping technologies and the Nanakuli find.
- 3/5/15 IC Rob Curtiss was interviewed by Mike Tsai from the Star Advertiser about the new trapping technologies and the Nanakuli find.
- 3/3/15 Liaison officer Randy Bartlett presented CRB information at the Waianae Neighborhood Board #24 meeting. Approximately 30 people attended.
- A total of 107 persons were provided outreach information and materials during this reporting period.
- **Beetle Fact:** CRB damage is caused by the adult stage, specifically young adults that bore into the crowns of healthy palms.
