## Farm Labor Statistics State of Hawaii, 2020

With the onset of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic in Hawaii, the count of all hired workers dropped sharply by 20% to 4,000 in April 2020. The number of hours worked in the reference week also fell by 1.7 hours as compared to the corresponding week in 2019. Likewise, the average wage paid to hired workers was down 5 cents to \$16.87 an hour in the same comparable periods.

Hawaii agriculturalists also hired 135 guest workers on H-2A visas by June 30, 2020 (0.06% of U.S. total). The gross wage rate at the high-end range for guest workers was \$1.97 an hour lower than that for all hired workers. The distribution of the hired H-2A workers in Hawaii into different agricultural classification is as follows: livestock (4), apiculture (19), coffee (21) and general farm workers (91).
