To import Camelids (*Alpacas, Llamas*) into Hawaii, the following requirements shall be met prior to entry. Animals <u>not meeting pre-entry requirements may be refused entry into the state and returned to their point</u> of origin at the importer's expense.

UPDATE - A permit to import camelids will be required starting December 22, 2023

Pre-shipment requirements for CAMELIDS Entering the State of Hawaii

- 1. Animals must originate from a herd that is **not under quarantine**.
- 2. Animals must be free from external parasites and symptoms of transmissible diseases and have not had recent exposure to these diseases.
- 3. Animals must be negative to an intradermal tuberculin test by state, federal or accredited veterinarian 30 days or less before shipment.
- 4. Animals must be uniquely identified (microchip or official ear tag)
- 5. Animals must be treated under the supervision of a veterinarian with an approved pesticide at a **concentration to kill ticks** within 7 days of shipment.
- 6. Acquire a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) from a licensed, accredited veterinarian
 - a) Required items on the CVI
 - i. The CVI is issued **seven (7) days** or less before shipment, by a licensed, accredited (category II level) veterinarian, and the issue date is recorded on the CVI.
 - ii. Animal description including the following: age, sex, breed, unique identifying number (microchip or official ear tag)
 - iii. Results of the intradermal tuberculin test
 - iv. Statement which indicates the veterinarian inspected and found camelids to be free of external parasites, and supervised the prophylactic pesticide application. Statement required:

"I personally inspected the camelids on this CVI and found them to be free of ticks. They have, under my supervision, been treated with an approved pesticide to kill ticks within 7 days of shipment."

v. The following statement is to appear on the CVI for all livestock entering Hawaii originating from states affected with Vesicular Stomatitis for the duration of the VS outbreaks:

"I have examined all the animals identified on this certificate within 72 hours of shipment date and found them to be free from signs of Vesicular Stomatitis (VS). During the last thirty (30) days, these animals have not been exposed to VS nor located on a VS confirmed or a VS suspected premises."

7. *UPDATE* Request a CAMELID Import permit from the Animal Industry Division when copies of the CVI and official test charts are available for review. Once pre-shipment requirements are met, a Camelid Import Permit will be issued. The import permit and CVI must accompany the shipment. Documents will be reviewed and permits will be issued daily during business hours. To request an import permit contact the Animal Industry Division:

It is the responsibility of the owner or authorized agent of the owner to present a **COMPLETE**, **LEGIBLE**, **ORIGINAL** hardcopy of the CVI which meets the State of Hawaii's pre-shipment requirements at entry inspection.
