PESTICIDE USE REVOLVING FUND Annual Report to Legislature for Fiscal Year 2001

Background

In the Twentieth State Legislature, Regular Session of 2000, Act 154 was passed which amended Chapter 149A-13.5 to add a subsection (f), which requires the Department of Agriculture to submit an annual report to the legislature on all moneys deposited into, and disbursed from the pesticide use revolving fund. The following information is reported:

- 1. Licensing and registration fees and charges collected by the department for pesticides products and training fees;
- 2. Expenditures for registration and licensing, certification and education, and compliance monitoring activities;
- 3. Fees set for educational services and training;
- 4. Interest earned on the deposit or investment of the funds; and
- 5. Balance lapsed into the State general fund.

Executive Summary

This report covers the period from July 1, 2000 to June 30, 2001. The budget was increased from \$250,000 to \$450,000 for this fiscal year. The means of financing for four positions in the registration and certification section was changed from the general fund to this fund. Personnel costs accounted for about \$190,000 of the \$450,000 budget. Approximately \$485,100 was collected from pesticide product licensing. No fees were collected for training. Interest earned was \$28,412.92. The amount of cash returned to the general fund was \$3,150.

Funds encumbered in prior fiscal years affect the balance reported in the fund. To show all fund activity regardless of the year the funds were encumbered, the following summary is provided:

A. Pesticide Use Revolving Fund Revenue:

Licensing and registration fees and charges collected by the department for pesticides products and training fees are the two sources of revenue to the Pesticides Use Revolving Fund. In fiscal year 2001, \$485,100 in licensing fees was collected. The remaining

receipts reported above include credit of vacation leave from the general fund for staff now funded from the pesticide use revolving fund and interest. No training fees were collected.

B. Pesticide Use Revolving Fund Expenditures

Expenditures for registration and licensing, certification and education, and compliance monitoring activities are based on the amount of funds spent or encumbered for Fiscal Year 2001. Funds encumbered in fiscal years prior to FY 2001 are not shown.

1. Registration and Licensing

Personnel costs for four staff in the Certification and Registration Section were charged to the pesticide use revolving fund. These personnel are the section chief and registration specialists, who are most directly related to the licensing of pesticides and collecting of pesticide-licensing fees. Personnel costs were \$185,814.48.

Miscellaneous expenses for this activity area included funding travel for some of the projects listed above, storage space for old pesticide labels and material safety data sheets. Total support from the pesticide use revolving fund for the pesticides registration and licensing was approximately \$300,000.
